



Mesquite and Epoxy Bowl ~ Lon Kelley



· Cross-sectional view of bowl and laminated wood to be cut to desired form 7/12/03

Mesquite and Epoxy Bowl -- Lon Kelley



- · Sketch or draw desired shape of bowl · Design and acquire or make a form for shaping the bowl
- while epoxy is poured
- The form should be of a shape for which close-fitting pieces can be cut 7/12/03






- · Clean up mesquite logs on lathe
- Set up bandsaw to cut the radius and size of pieces to fit the corresponding area on form

Mesquite and Epoxy Bowl ~ Lon Kelley



- · Trial fit band-sawed parts on form
- · Plan for method to pour epoxy

- · Cover form with plastic wrap so epoxy doesn't stick to form
- <u>Thoroughly</u> cover all spaces to contain epoxy with masking tape
- Leaks will quickly drain epoxy with mess and lost \$\$



- Epoxy was poured in two stages. One for the rim and one for the larger pieces of the bowl body and bottom
- Epoxied bowl shown in lathe after removal of form and ready to skim cut the outside surface

Mesquite and Epoxy Bowl - Lon Kelley



- · Inside of bowl in lathe after partial skim cutting Bowl on table and masking tape applied to the inside and outside to form rim
- · Pour epoxy into taped form to make the bowl rim

Mesquite and Epoxy Bowl - Lon Kelley

- · Finished bowl after sanding and spraying with polyurethane
- · Finishing steps included water-sanding with 400 grit wet paper and applying paste wax
