#### **Book Library:**

#### Show & Tell:

John Murray had 6 clocks. He buys his works from Cherrytree and Klockit. The plans came from Wood magazine.

Stan Coumbe showed some bamboo angels from Indonesia.

Chuck Maxwell had a router table made from plans from the book "Woodworking With The Router". He also had a childs swivel chair made from maple. The swivel assembly was made from heavy wall threaded conduit and a 4 bolt pipe flange.

Steve Procter brought a spice cabinet made from mahogany. His daughter, Amanda, helped him with this project.

Dooley George showed a vegetable bin with tip out doors. It was made from bowling alley maple using frame and panel construction. The bottom was finished with 6 coats of Bartleys. The top was finished with Minwax polyurethane. He used 2 coats of gloss and 2 coats of satin.

#### **Charity Project:**

Jimmie Harp will be the coordinator of the charity project. He will gather the material and coordinate the labor.

#### December Program:

The December program was given by Jimmie Harp on Long Leaf Pine and the Texas lumber industry.

Long leaf pine is the strongest and most beautiful of the pines. It is also known as pitch pine and heart pine. It was liked, not for it's beauty, but for its long straight grain and its strength. In Texas it grew mainly in east Texas and liked sandy and well drained soil. It reproduced with difficulty and with the logging methods used by the early lumber industry it has been replaced by loblolly pine and hardwoods.

Early visitors were overpowered by the towering pines. The described them as 100-150 feet tall and 4-5 feet in diameter at the base. The forest floor was park like because not mush else could grow under these giant trees.

Today our source for this fine wood is from old buildings that have been torn down. Fortunately the wood is being recycled. It is also fairly expensive, ranging from \$3.00 - \$8.00 per board foot. A lot of the reclaimed wood is being turned into flooring.

The first big sawmill in Texas was the Lotcher & Moore mill at Orange. It opened in 1877 and closed in 1930 because of the depression.

It had a capacity of 80,000-100,000 board feet a day. It had circular saws that were later replaced with bandsaws. They also used gang saws. These were able to cut a squared up cant into dimensional boards in a single pass.

In the era from 1877 to the depression, more than 59 billion board feet of lumber was produced.

Henry Lotcher and G. Moore were the pioneers of the early Texas lumber industry. They were followed by the people many of us have heard of; such as Joseph H. Kurth, Thomas L.L. Temple, John Henry Kirby, Alexander Gilmer, David Wingate, John Martin Thompson, and W. T. Carter.

The coming of the railroad was a great boon to the lumber industry. The Southern rivers were not dependable to get to logs to the mills. The logs were drug to the lines by teams of horses, oxen, or bulls. These were later replaced by steam loaders.

This was an interesting program. I wish I would have been there to hear it.
