# Toy of the Month Preview

#### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT**

Frankenlumber

I make a lot of end grain cutting boards. I start with 8/4 rough material, typically maple and walnut. In milling the rough timbers into useable shape, and finally into the individual components of the board, I have lots of leftovers clogging up my shelves and contributing to my wood hoarding tendencies. I am experimenting to recreate the starting point lumber from my scraps in the hope that I will end up with an interesting board.

I gathered all my walnut pieces that were at least 20 inches long and 1 inch thick. The more random the widths, the better. I cut all the pieces to 20 inches in length and 1 inch thick. Some of the wider pieces I cut into small widths to give more variety.

I then jointed one side of each piece, then planed the opposite side until straight and smooth. I split the pieces into two 7-inch panels, mixing up the widths and colors as much as possible. I glued up the two panels separately and let the glue cure overnight.

The next day I cleaned up the panels by jointing one face and planning the other side flat and smooth. I then glued the two panels on top of one another to create a single 2-inch thick panel. The glue on that panel will need quite a while to fully cure!

I am in the process of repeating the process with the maple pieces. My goal is to have maple and walnut "lumber" that is at least 7 inches wide, 2 inches thick and 20 inches long made from a random assortment of parts. In the picture below, the walnut panels are glued face-to-face on the left, while the maple panels are glued edge-to edge on the right. What's that old woodworking adage about clamps?

I hope to have the board ready for a future Show-and-Tell.

#### 2024 Hardwood Derby


Pictures from the Hardwood Derby 2023



















































#### **Meet the Member**
