MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Finishing the frame saw,

Last month, I talked about selecting, laminating, and milling the stock for my frame saw project. I can now say that the saw is complete, and it is something of a beast! At 34" long and 18" wide and made from white oak and mahogany, it is a bit more to handle than I was expecting.

For the rails, I had to mill down the laminated stock to final dimensions, while keeping the orientation correct. I wanted the mahogany center strips to flow across the handles and rails. The instructions call for leaving the rails extra long until after the first tenon is cut on one end. My guess is that they know my penchant for mistakes and wanted to give me some cushion!

I used a dado stack to cut the ¾" x ¾" tenons on the ends of the rails, and a 1/8" deep dado where the rails will fit into the handles. Then it was the work of matching the tenons to their mortises in handles. My dado stack does not cut as smooth a tenon as I would like, so it was a bit of work to get a smoothly fitting tenon. I also had to cut a shallow notch in one handle to accept the iron bracket for the blade.

Now that all the joinery was done, it was time to shape the handles. I used my bandsaw fitted with a 3/16", 4 tpi blade to get the shape close to the lines, then sanding to the lines, roundovers wherever needed on the handles and rails, and final sanding to 180 grit.

The finish is Odie's Oil for a good upper body workout and a light coat of wax for additional protection. I think it turned out quite well and I am looking forward to mastering its use. Next up is the frame saw's companion, the kerfing plane.

Use wood of 1-1/2 to 1-3/4 thickness. Andy will have some poplar blanks available at the next meeting.

We will also have tables showing our wood projects and introduce people to our club. In addition, we'll have some activities using the club workbench. WWCH participation at HCCC events is a community service working with children and has brought in new members.




